What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the S&P/ASX 200 Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The S&P/ASX 200 Fund invests in Australian shares and designed to track the return (before tax, fees and other expenses) on the S&P/ASX 200 Index.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the S&P/ASX 200 Fund¹



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.


Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund on 15 July 2020 and did not make any further contributions. On 30 September 2020, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted of -\$6 (that is -0.06% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$5 (Jess received statements and other SuperLife communications electronically and was not charged the paper statements fee). This gives Jess a total loss after tax of -\$11 for the 2 months and 15 days.

Material changes

Notes

- 1 Market index returns (as well as actual returns) have been used to complete the risk indicator, as the fund has not been in existence for 5 years. As a result, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund. The risk indicator for the fund uses 4 years and 10 months of market index returns.
- 2 The administration fee is stated net of an income tax deduction applied in calculating your PIE tax payable (the deduction is paid to us). The relevant gross fee is calculated using your PIR.
- 3 The top 10 investments listed in the table exclude current assets and current liabilities, and as a result do not sum to 100%.
