## SuperLife Conservative Fund

### Fund update for the quarter ended 31 December 2023

This fund update was first made publicly available on 12 February 2024.

### What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the SuperLife Conservative Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

### Description of this fund

Invests mostly in income assets and is designed for investors that want a conservative investment option. Negative annual returns may occur once in every 7-10 years on average.

### What are the risks of investing?

#### Risk indicator for the SuperLife Conservative Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

### How has the fund performed?

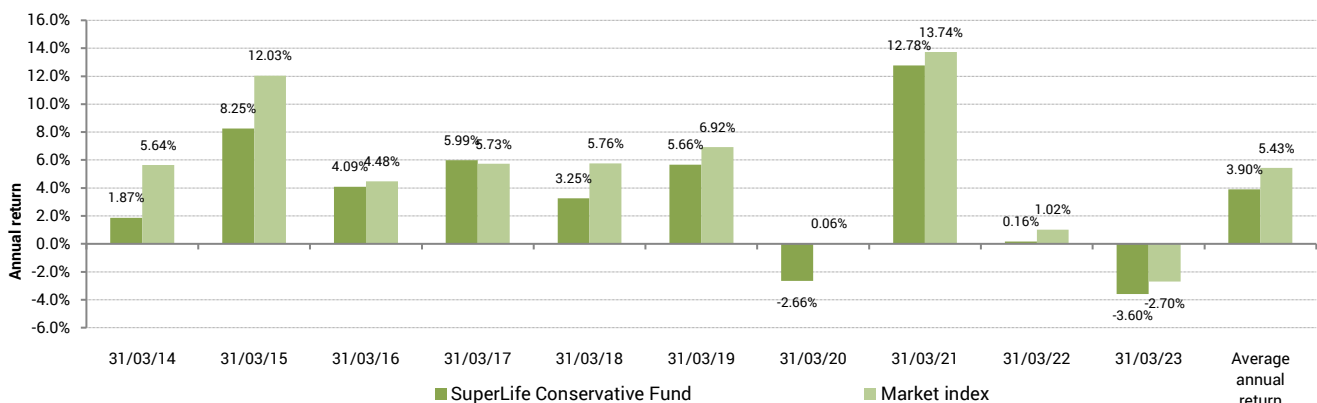

The market index return is a composite of benchmark index returns, weighted for the fund's target investment mix (also known as target asset allocation). The specific benchmark indices used for each asset class are defined in the Statement of Investment Policy and Objectives (SIPO).

On 11 December 2023, the fund's benchmark indices for the international equities and listed property asset classes were updated to better reflect the investment philosophy of the fund.

### Annual return graph





This shows the return after fund charges and tax for each of the last 10 years ending 31 March. The last bar shows the average annual return for the last 10 years, up to 31 December 2023.

### What fees are investors charged?

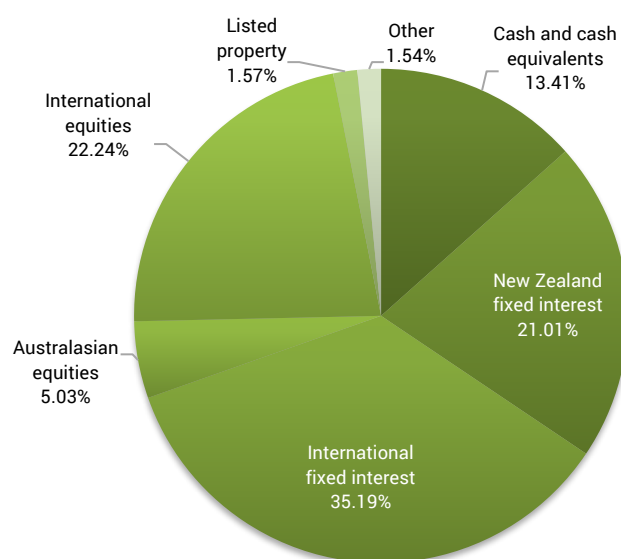
### Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted but before tax of \$772 (that is 7.72% of Jess's initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$60. This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$653 for the year.

## Currency hedging

As at 29 December 2023 the fund's exposure to assets denominated in foreign currencies was 60.93%, of which 78.48% was hedged. This means the fund's unhedged foreign currency exposure was 13.11% of the net asset value of the fund. ## Notes

- These charges refer to the normal fund operating costs that are charged to the fund. For disclosure purposes, supervisor, audit and legal costs are not included in the manager's basic fee, but are included in the other management and administration charges. Some of these are fixed costs so the amount shown can range from 0% up to the total fund charges depending on the total value of the fund.
- The 'other' category refers to an investment in infrastructure. The underlying investments are infrastructure securities listed in developed countries.
