### Fund update for the quarter ended 31 March 2020

This fund update was first made publicly available on 1 May 2020.

### What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the NZ Dividend Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

### Description of this fund

The NZ Dividend Fund invests in the Smartshares Exchange Traded Funds' Smartshares NZ Dividend ETF.

### What are the risks of investing?

#### Risk indicator for the NZ Dividend Fund<sup>1</sup>



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

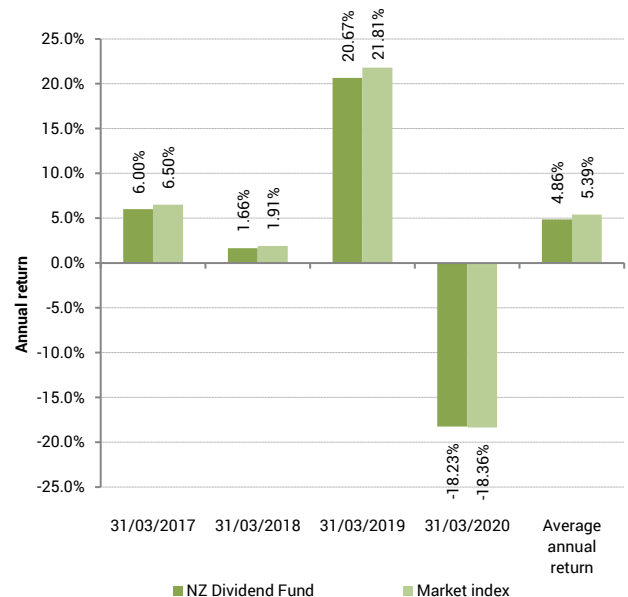

GST is included in the fund charges set out above.

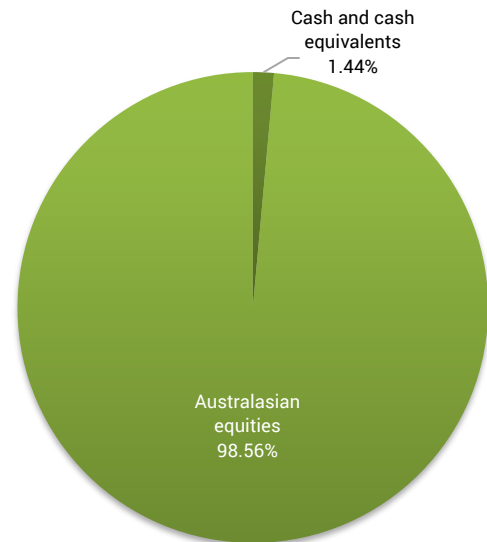
### Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of -\$1,823 (that is -18.23% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$12. This gives Jess a total loss after tax of -\$1,835 for the year.

## Material changes

## Notes

- The Smartshares NZ Dividend ETF is also managed by Smartshares. As a result, the table lists the individual assets of the Smartshares NZ Dividend ETF as if they were individual assets directly held by the fund.
