This fund update was first made publicly available on 1 May 2019.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Overseas Bonds Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Overseas Bonds Fund is designed to provide a return (after tax, fees and other expenses) that reflects the after-tax return on international bond markets of developed economies.

Total value of the fund: \$59,660,663

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Overseas Bonds Fund¹



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Note that even the lowest category does not mean a risk-free investment, and there are other risks that are not captured by this rating.

While risk indicators are usually relatively stable, they do shift from time to time. The risk indicator will continue to be updated in future fund updates.

Other specific risks

There are other risks that may increase the risk to returns for investors, which are not reflected in the risk indicator. These risks include investment management risk. In particular, while SuperLife Invest's philosophy is

that a passive approach to investing will deliver better long-term results, we make some active management decisions. There is a risk that this may result in the fund achieving a return that is lower than its investment objective.

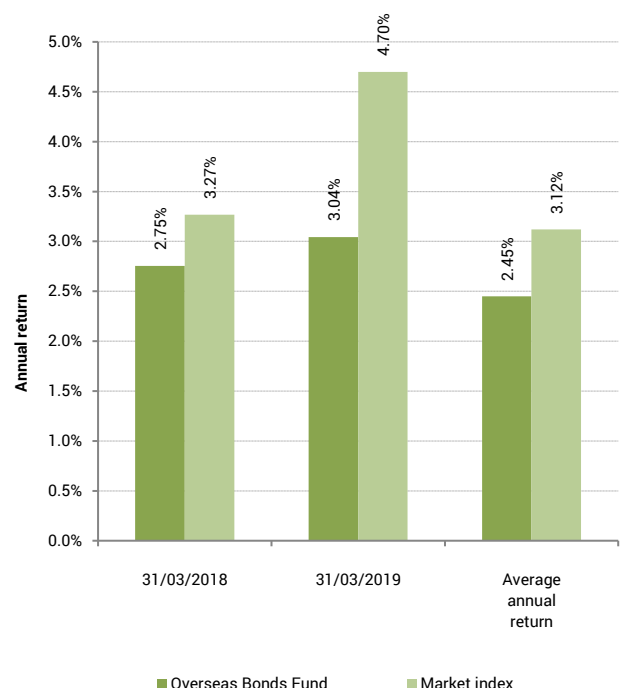

How has the fund performed?

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

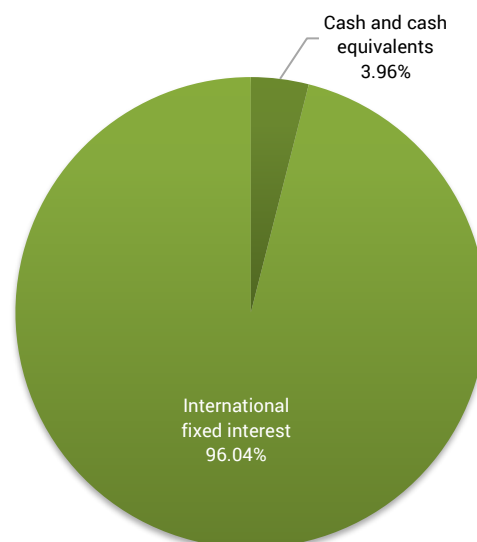
Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$304 (that is 3.04% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$12. This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$292 for the year.
