Fund update for the quarter ended 30 June 2020

This fund update was first made publicly available on 28 July 2020.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the SuperLife High Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Invests in growth assets and designed for investors that want an aggressive investment option that invests in shares and property. Negative annual returns may occur once in every 2–4 years on average.

Total value of the fund: \$484,582,321

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the SuperLife High Growth Fund ¹



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

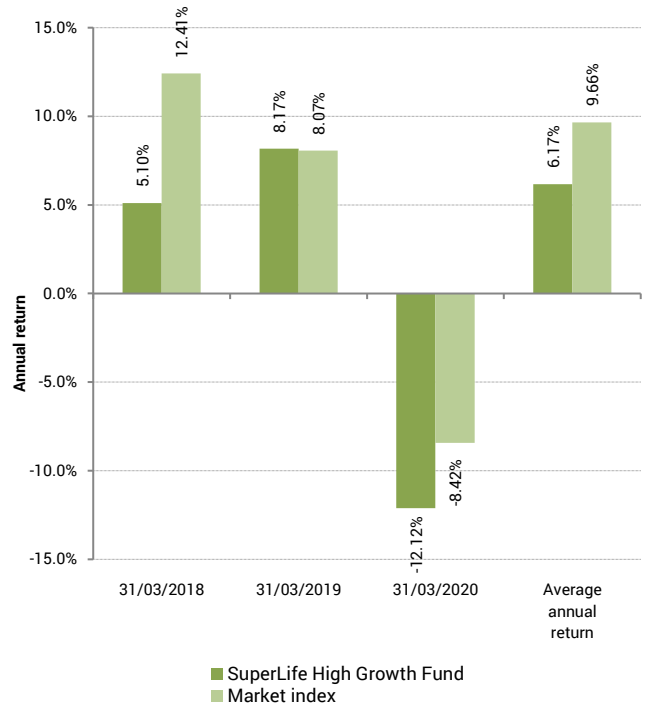

GST is included in the fund charges set out above.

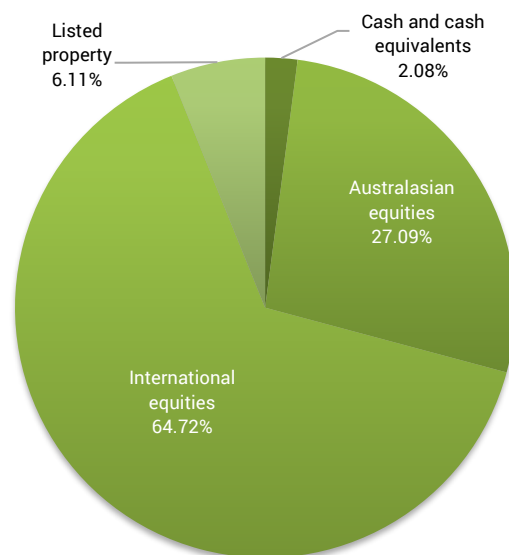
Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of -\$407 (that is -4.07% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$12. This gives Jess a total loss after tax of -\$419 for the year.

Currency hedging

The fund's foreign currency exposure is hedged to the New Zealand dollar. The target hedging level is 77%. The actual hedging level can be anywhere in the 0% - 120% range. As at 30 June 2020, 77.40% of the fund's foreign currency exposure was hedged.

Material changes

There have been no material changes to the nature of SuperLife Invest, the investment objectives and strategy of the fund, or the management of the scheme over the quarter ended 30 June 2020.

Notes

- Market index returns (as well as actual returns) have been used to complete the risk indicator, as the fund has not been in existence for 5 years. As a result, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund. The risk indicator for the fund uses 1 year and 4 months of market index returns.
- The administration fee is stated net of an income tax deduction applied in calculating your PIE tax payable (the deduction is paid to us). The relevant gross fee is calculated using your PIR.
