What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Global Bond ETF Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Global Bond ETF Fund invests in the Smartshares Exchange Traded Funds' Global Bond Fund.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Global Bond ETF Fund ¹



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Note that even the lowest category does not mean a risk-free investment, and there are other risks that are not captured by this rating.

While risk indicators are usually relatively stable, they do shift from time to time. The risk indicator will continue to be updated in future fund updates.

Other specific risks

There are other risks that may increase the risk to returns for investors, which are not reflected in the risk indicator. These risks include active management risk. In particular, the fund invests in an actively managed fund, the investment manager of which buys and sells financial products based on its own assessment of what is happening in the market. There is a risk that the investment manager selects investments for the actively managed fund that result in the Global Bond ETF Fund achieving a return that is lower than its investment objective.



How has the fund performed?

Annual return graph



This shows the return after fund charges and tax for each year ending 31 March since the fund started. The last bar shows the average annual return since the fund started, up to 30 June 2017.

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.


Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$295 (that is 2.95% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$32³. This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$263 for the year.

Notes

- 1 Market index returns (as well as actual returns) have been used to complete the risk indicator, as the fund has not been in existence for 5 years. As a result, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund. The risk indicator for the fund uses 3 years and 5 months of market index returns.
- 2 On 9 November 2016, the total management and administration charges changed to 0.59% per annum. As a result, the total fund charges will be different in the year to 31 March 2018.
- 3 On 9 November 2016, the administration fee changed to \$30 per annum. As a result, the amount set out in the fees table is made up of 4 months of \$2.50 per month (when the administration fee was \$30 per annum) and 8 months of \$2.75 per month (when the administration fee was \$33 per annum).
