What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Global Property Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Global Property Fund is designed to provide a return (after tax, fees and other expenses) that reflects the after-tax return on New Zealand and international property markets.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Global Property Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher

potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

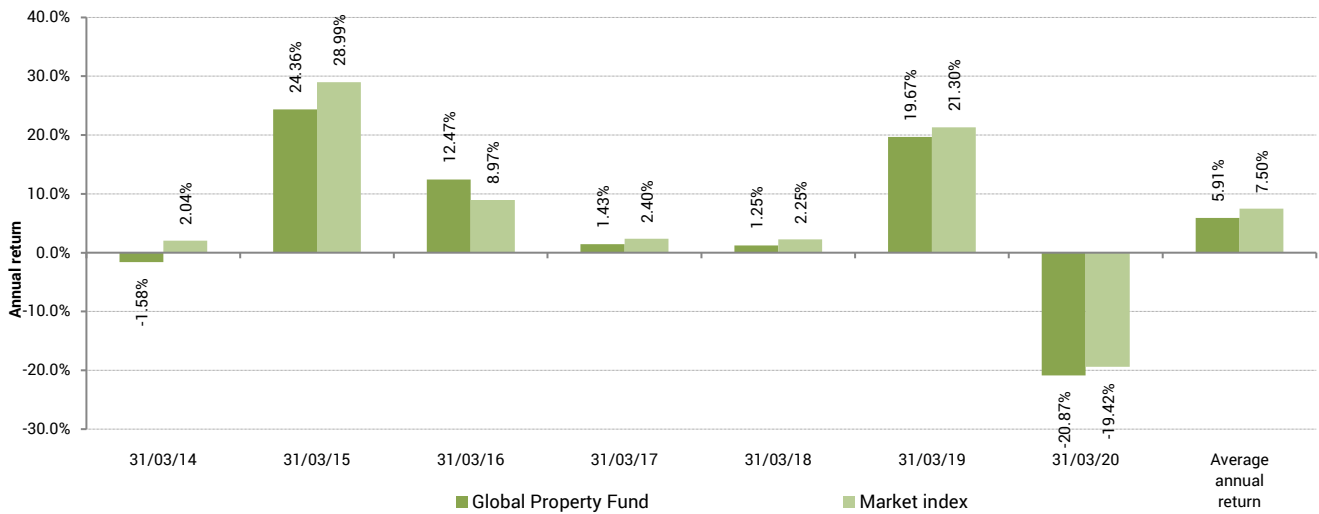
How has the fund performed?

GST is included in the fund charges set out above.

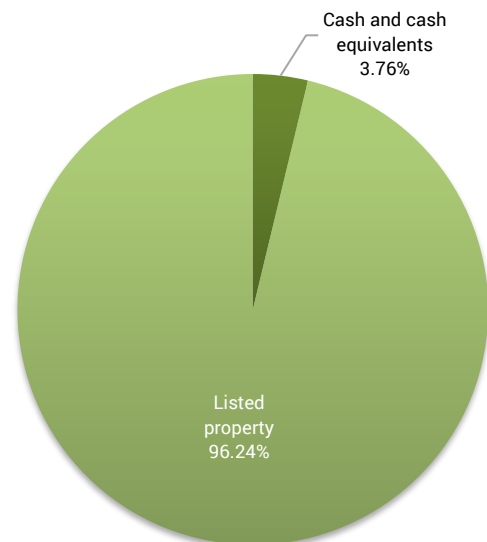
Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of -\$2,087 (that is -20.87% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$60. This gives Jess a total loss after tax of -\$2,147 for the year.

The fund's foreign currency exposure may be hedged to the New Zealand dollar, and hedging levels will vary between 0% and 110%. As at 31 March 2020, 95.37% of the fund's foreign currency exposure was hedged.
