This fund update was first made publicly available on 31 October 2022.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the SuperLife Conservative Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Invests mostly in income assets and is designed for investors that want a conservative investment option. Negative annual returns may occur once in every 7-10 years on average.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the SuperLife Conservative Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.



How has the fund performed?


Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of -\$867 (that is -8.67% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$60. This gives Jess a total loss after tax of -\$927 for the year.

Currency hedging

The fund's foreign currency exposure is hedged to the New Zealand dollar. The target hedging level is 88%. The actual hedging level can be anywhere in the 0% - 120% range. As at 30 September 2022, 84.19% of the fund's foreign currency exposure was hedged.

Notes

- 1 The fund charges will be increasing by 0.10% per annum of the fund's net asset value, from 12 December 2022
- 2 We charge fixed fund charges that cover normal fund operating costs. For disclosure purposes, supervisor, audit and legal costs are not included in the manager's basic fee, but are included in the other management and administration charges. This may be shown as 0.00% due to rounding.
- 3 The 'other' category refers to an investment in infrastructure. The underlying investments are infrastructure securities listed in developed countries.
