This fund update was first made publicly available on 29 October 2024.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the S&P/NZX 50 Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The S&P/NZX 50 Fund invests in New Zealand shares and is designed to track the return (before tax, fees and other expenses) of the S&P/NZX 50 Index.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the S&P/NZX 50 Fund¹



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.




Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted but before tax of \$1,124 (that is 11.24% of Jess's initial \$10,000). Jess also paid \$60 in other charges. This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$963 for the year.

Notes

- 1 Market index returns (as well as actual returns) have been used to complete the risk indicator, as the fund has not been in existence for 5 years. As a result, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund. The risk indicator for the fund uses 10 months of market index returns.
- 2 These charges refer to the normal fund operating costs that are charged to the fund. For disclosure purposes, supervisor, audit and legal costs are not included in the manager's basic fee, but are included in the other management and administration charges. Some of these are fixed costs so the amount shown can range from 0% up to the total fund charges depending on the total value of the fund.
