This fund update was first made publicly available on 26 July 2019.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Global Property Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Global Property Fund is designed to provide a return (after tax, fees and other expenses) that reflects the after-tax return on New Zealand and international property markets.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Global Property Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher

potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Note that even the lowest category does not mean a risk-free investment, and there are other risks that are not captured by this rating.

While risk indicators are usually relatively stable, they do shift from time to time. The risk indicator will continue to be updated in future fund updates.

Other specific risks

There are other risks that may increase the risk to returns for investors, which are not reflected in the risk indicator. These risks include investment management risk. In particular, while the SuperLife workplace savings scheme's philosophy is that a passive approach to investing will deliver better long-term results, we make some active management decisions. There is a risk that this may result in the fund achieving a return that is lower than its investment objective.

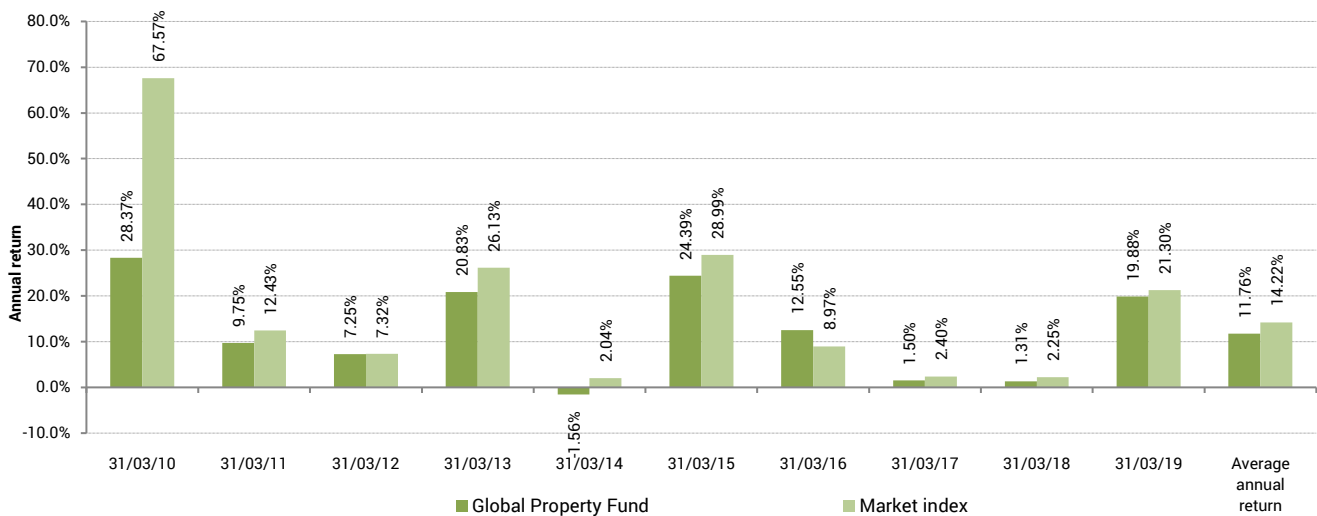
How has the fund performed?

This shows the return after fund charges and tax for each year ending 31 March since the fund started. The last bar shows the average annual return since the fund started, up to 30 June 2019.

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

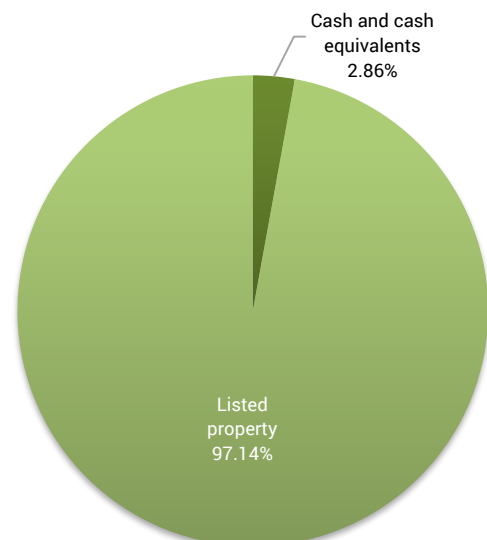
Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,444 (that is 14.44% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$12. This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$1,432 for the year.

The fund's foreign currency exposure may be hedged to the New Zealand dollar, and hedging levels will vary between 0% and 110%. As at 30 June 2019, 98.98% of the fund's foreign currency exposure was hedged.
