Fund update for the quarter ended 30 September 2023

This fund update was first made publicly available on 21 December 2023.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Ethica Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Designed for investors that want a balance between stability of returns and growth of their investment over the long term. Provides exposure to a diverse selection of global companies and income assets that align with our Responsible Investment Policy. We exclude assets that do not meet our socially responsible investment standards, and increase or decrease exposure to companies based on their environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Ethica Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher



How has the fund performed?

Annual return graph


Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted but before tax of \$688 (that is 6.88% of Jess's initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$12. This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$568 for the year.

Currency hedging

As at 29 September 23 the fund's exposure to assets denominated in foreign currencies was 67.23%, of which 72.82% was hedged. This means the fund's unhedged foreign currency exposure was 18.27% of the net asset value of the fund. Notes

- These charges refer to the normal fund operating costs that are charged to the fund.
