What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Ethica Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Designed for investors that want a balance between stability of returns and growth of their investment over the long term. Provides exposure to a diverse selection of global companies and income assets that align with our Responsible Investment Policy. We exclude assets that do not meet our socially responsible investment standards, and increase or decrease exposure to companies based on their environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors.

How has the fund performed?

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted but before tax of \$1,016 (that is 10.16% of Jess's initial \$10,000). Jess also paid \$12 in other charges. This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$881 for the year.

Currency hedging

As at 27 June 2024 the fund's exposure to assets denominated in foreign currencies was 69.17%, of which 69.55% was hedged. This means the fund's unhedged foreign currency exposure was 21.06% of the net asset value of the fund.
